EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Physical Appearance: Clear, liquid/ light floral fragrance

IMMEDIATE HEALTH EFFECTS

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SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURES

EYES: Flush eyes with water for at least 15 minutes. If irritation persists, consult a physician.
